If proposing a new amendment to add to the Constitution or Bylaws select a new number in sequence with the section article or bylaw.) **Proposed Amendment Changes** 1.3.2 9th Grade School of First Choice - A 9th-grade student entering high school for the 1st time shall establish his/her eligibility at any LHSAA school of their choice and shall be immediately eligible for all sports at all levels, unless the student signs the 8th Grade Participation Form. Once eligibility is established, they shall be a bona fide student at the school of first choice, and if a student transfers to another LHSAA school after establishing a school of first choice, then all Transfer Students rules shall apply. Transfers Within the Athletic Attendance Zone: If at any time a student transfers from one member school to 1.13.3 another member school in the same attendance zone, the student shall become immediately ineligible for varsity athletics for a period of one calendar year from the date of enrollment/attendance in the second school. Students in 10th or 11th grades and not in their senior year shall remain eligible for sub-varsity athletics. The student may be eligible at his/her school of first choice in the attendance zone. A transfer student will be ineligible for a period of one calendar year at the new school unless he/she transfers under one of the following exceptions: Outside the Athletic Attendance Zone: Any student who attends a school outside his/her athletic attendance 1.13.4 zone shall be ineligible to participate in interscholastic Varsity athletics, but will be eligible for sub-varsity at that school for a period of one calendar year from his/her first day of attendance unless he/she transfers under one of the following exceptions: 1. A student in 10th or 11th grades and not in their senior year who is transferring outside his/her athletic attendance zone shall be eligible to participate at the sub-varsity level. 2. The student continuously attended the entire 7th and/or 8th grades at a middle/junior high school of that same member school or school system located outside of his/her athletic attendance zone. The school shall be required to register and certify the student's eligibility status on the Members' Only website. 3. Students who have been accepted into a program and attend the school at the first opportunity (9th grade), should be granted full participation after verification of acceptance. Students should meet all requirements of acceptance into the program. Please list ALL bylaws and/or articles that are affected by this amendment: Explanation of proposed amendment(s): This Bylaw change would allow students entering the 9th grade to make a first choice and be eligible for Subvarsity and Varsity. Proposed Amendment Changes

- 1.7 MEDICAL HISTORY EVALUATION AND EXAMINATION To be eligible for interscholastic athletics, all students shall have his/her parent(s)/guardian properly complete and sign an LHSAA Medical History Evaluation Form and pass a medical examination administered by a licensed physician (Doctors of allopathic medicine (M.D.) and doctors of osteopathic medicine (D.O.)), a licensed nurse practitioner in collaboration with a licensed physician, and/or a licensed physician's assistant under the supervision of a licensed physician. prior to the first time he/she practices or participates in a sport at an LHSAA school. This requirement must be fulfilled annually prior to the student's first participation in any sport at an LHSAA-affiliated school. A copy of a current, properly completed and signed medical history and medical examination form shall be on file at a school for every student-athlete at all times.
- 1.7.1 Once a student passes the initial medical examination and completes an LHSAA Medical History Evaluation Form as required in Bylaw 1.7, he/she shall annually pass a medical screening or medical examination administered by a licensed physician (Doctors of allopathic medicine (M.D.) and doctors of osteopathic medicine (D.O.)), a licensed nurse practitioner that is in collaboration with a licensed physician, and/or a licensed physician's assistant under the supervision of a licensed physician and shall update the LHSAA Medical History Evaluation Form. The LHSAA Medical History Evaluation form is valid for 13 months from the date in which it is performed.

Explanation of proposed amendment(s):

In response to a recent inquiry about athletic preparticipation physicals, the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee (SMAC) has the following recommendation for LHSAA Executive Committee to consider.

To follow the guidance set forth by the American Academy of Pediatrics regarding preparticipation physical evaluations, which only recognizes healthcare providers as (MD, DO, NP, or PA) as authorized to sign off on preparticipation physicals. This guidance is endorsed by the National Federation of State High School Associations.

Pros: (Must have at least one)

To ensure consistency with the Louisiana Concussion Act, which defines a physician under R.S. 37:1262(2) as a natural person who is the holder of an allopathic (M.D.) degree or an osteopathic (D.O.) degree from a medical college in good standing with the board who holds a license, permit, certification, or registration issued by the board to engage in the practice of medicine in the state of Louisiana. Doctors of allopathic medicine (M.D.) and doctors of osteopathic medicine (D.O.) shall be accorded equal professional status and unrestricted privileges in the practice of medicine. The use of the term "physician" in this Part shall not be construed to prohibit the use of such term by other health care providers specifically authorized to use such term by any other lawful provision of this state.

Cons: (*Must have at least one*)

The SMAC recognizes Chiropractors (DC) as physicians and considers them a valuable athletic healthcare team member. However, at this time the committee does not recommend permitting Chiropractors (DC) to complete and determine clearance on athletic preparticipation physicals for the high school athletes, in addition to the current permitted healthcare providers (MD, DO, APRN, or PA).

If a bye(s) on the bracket exists due to any qualifiers not being represented from a district, the bye(s) shall be filled using the remaining teams from those being considered for wildcard.

- 10.8.2 In completing the playoff bracket, all other teams qualifying for the state playoffs shall be selected on the basis of the established power rating system. Schools that fail to play 15 contests during the regular season, including district play and tournament games, shall be ranked separately using the same ranking system that is used to rank schools that played at least 15 contests or more during the regular season. These schools shall be ranked at the bottom of the bracket and seeded accordingly until all remaining positions on the bracket are filled.
- 10.8.3 The remainder of the byes on the bracket shall be filled with wildcard teams (teams that did not automatically qualify) with the highest power rating in descending order to fill the bracket.
- 10.9 <u>SEEDING THE BRACKET</u> In Non Select Divisions I—IV, all teams shall be seeded 1-24 Classes 1A -2A, 3A, 4A 5A, all teams shall be seeded 1-32 Class B seed 1-24 according to their power rating, and Class B and C teams shall be seeded 1-20. In Select Divisions I—IV teams shall be seeded 1-20 according to their power rating. Grouping of classes will be done by a percentage-based breakdown. Schools will be placed in a class based on their enrollment as it relates to the average enrollment of all schools.

10.11 PLAYOFFS - NON-SELECT

- **10.11.1** All playoff games shall be played on a "home and away" basis through the quarterfinal round for Division IV, Class B, and Class C.
- **10.11.4** If a playoff game is postponed because of inclement weather, darkness, or some other approved unforeseen reason, the Executive Director may grant an extension for the game. If the Executive Director grants the exception, the following shall apply:
 - 6. In Divisions I, II, and III, Classes B, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, and 5A, in the rounds of play that are decided by a best two out of three series, the following guidelines shall apply:
 - a. If no games are completed due to any reason prior to the Tuesday after the scheduled end of the series, the series shall be reduced to a single elimination game.
 - b. If only one game has been completed due to any reason prior to the Wednesday after the scheduled end of the series, the series shall be reduced to a single elimination game, and the game that was played shall be the game of record. The LHSAA shall serve as mediator to ensure each series is completed.
 - c. If two games have been completed and the series is tied and the third and final game cannot be played due to any reason prior to the Tuesday after the scheduled end of the series, Bylaw 10.11.4.2 shall be applied, and the final game shall be played on the next possible date.
- **10.11.5** The playoff system for Divisions I, II, and III, Classes B, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, and 5A, shall be as follows:
 - 1. Bi District Round Best two of three series at the home field of the higher seed.
 - 1. Regional Round Best two out of three series at the home field of the higher seeded team. Week 42: Double Elimination Tournament. Top seeds 1-8 host, seeds 9-24 seeded according to power rating. Bottom seeds 25-32 seeded by geography of host school 911 address (assigned by LHSAA). Class B Top seeds 1-8 host, seeds 9-16 seeded according to power rating. Bottom 17-24 seeded by geography of host school 911 address (assigned by LHSAA) play may start on a Wednesday and end on Saturday.
 - 2. Quarterfinal Round Best two out of three series at the home field of the higher seeded team.
 - 3. Semifinal Round Best two out of three series at the home field of the higher seeded team.
 - 4. Semifinal winners shall play for the state championship in a best two of three series at a site to be determined by the Executive Committee.
 - 2. Super Regional Round Week 43: Best two out of three series at the home field of the top seed team
 - 3. Each round may start on a Wednesday and end on Saturday.
- **10.11.6** Any division or class that has a bye in their bracket has the opportunity to play an "Exhibition" game with another team that has a 'bye' on its bracket. Division IV, Class B and Class C schools that qualify for playoff competition shall be allowed to play a three-game exhibition series during the NFHS 41st week. All exhibition games must be played before their first game in the playoffs.
- 10.11.7 Class C Playoffs starts in Week 41 to be able to have all finals on week 45
- 10.12 PLAYOFF FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS NON-SELECT
- **10.12.3** Disbursement of revenue from gross ticket receipts from the round shall be divided equally among schools <u>on</u> <u>days you play</u> after umpire game fee deductions.
- 10.13 STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS
- 10.13.1 The Executive Committee shall accept statewide bids to host baseball tournaments in all classes and divisions.
- **10.13.2** Division IV, Class B and C Quarterfinal winners shall play for the state championship in a single-elimination tournament. Divisions I, II, and III semifinal winners shall play for the state championship in a best two of three series. Classes 5A, 4A, 3A 2A, 1A and B shall compete for their respective State Championship in 4 team double elimination tournament.
 - The Executive Director shall secure possible sites for the state championship tournament(s) for all divisions and classes and present them to the Executive Committee for selection. The State Championships for C, B, 1A and 2A shall be scheduled to be played on Week 45. The State Championship for 3A, 4A, and 5A shall be scheduled to play on week 44. The Executive Director shall select/appoint the tournament director.
- 10.14 State Playoff Select
- 10.14.1 The playoff system for Select Divisions shall be as follows:
 - 1. Regional Round Best two out of three series at the home field of the higher seeded team. The Select



- Schools, or a committee chosen from their number, shall have the option to make this round of play a single elimination game for the lower enrollment division if necessary due to pitch count concerns.
- 2. Quarterfinal Round Best two out of three series at the home field of the higher seeded team. The Select Schools, or a committee chosen from their number, shall have the option to make this round of play a single elimination game for the lower enrollment division if necessary due to pitch count concerns.
- 3. Semi-Final Round Best two out of three series at the home field of the higher seed team.
- 4. Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, select baseball teams in all divisions shall compete for state championship honors at a site or sites selected by the select schools, or a committee chosen from their number. The tournament shall consist of a single elimination game in the final round of play in Divisions I, II, III, IV and V or the best two out of three series for Divisions I, II, III, and IV as determined by the select state championship committee.
- 10.14.2 The higher seeded team as determined under Bylaw 10.10, Power Ranking, shall be the home team.
- 10.14.3 The umpires utilized shall be selected and assigned by the LHSAA Director of Officials.
- **10.14.4** Game time for the regional and quarterfinal rounds of play shall be set by mutual agreement. If an agreement cannot be reached, the starting time shall be 6:00 p.m.
- 10.14.5 If a game is rained out, the home team shall have the authority to change the dates and/or tournament site.
- 10.14.6 The home team shall be responsible for the following:
 - 1. Organizing and managing the game
 - 2. Managing game finances
 - 3. Reporting each game's results to the LHSAA and media
- 10.14.7 Financial Arrangements (all Divisions, regional and quarterfinal rounds of play)
 - 1. Admission Prices shall be set by mutual agreement of the participating schools.
 - 2. The home team retains the rights to 100% of concession sales and souvenir program sales.
 - 3. Disbursement of revenue from gross ticket receipts shall be divided equally among schools after officials' game fee is deducted.
 - 4. Home team shall be responsible for securing and compensation for the following:
 - a. Officials Hotel Fee (if necessary)
 - b. Official Scorekeepers
 - c. Ticket Sellers and Takers
 - d.Security
 - e. Ground Crew
 - f. Baseballs and other items necessary to conduct the game.
 - g. Field Rental (if necessary)
 - 5. The visiting team is responsible for its travel expenses.

Explanation of proposed amendment(s):

This will allow teams to expand participation by bringing a fourth competing golfer to the state tournament. This increase corresponds with the increased playing opportunities and participation numbers on various junior golf tours in Louisiana.

- The statewide Louisiana Junior Golf Tour, operated by the Louisiana Golf Association, has seen its participation numbers and number of events each double between 2020 and 2025.
- The Southeast Louisiana-based Kelly Gibson Junior Golf Tour has seen its girls' participation grow by 10 members since 2021 and has increased its schedule by 4 tournaments.
- The U.S. Kids Golf Tour, with its Gulf Coast tour hosting events in Southeast Louisiana and the MS Coast, was originally for kids 6-12, has now added divisions for ages 13-18 and has become another popular option for competitive girl golfers at the high school age.

The increase in participants does not change the scoring method of two lowest scores recorded each day. It simply increases the opportunity for a few more female golfers to participate in post season competition

Explanation of proposed amendment(s):

The proposed amendment would delay the official start of the softball season allowing multisport athletes the opportunity to participate more completely in a second sport should they choose to do so. Currently, athletes who play basketball, soccer, and/or cheerlead (especially at smaller schools) miss out on the majority of preseason and/or, if the school is successful in any of the aforementioned sports, athletes can also miss out on regular season games. Due to the large overlap of winter and spring sports seasons, it has become increasingly difficult to entice athletes to play more than one sport. Schools, in particularly small schools, currently have to delay or cancel games due to lack of athletes still competing in other sports. Delaying the start of the softball season would also give the opportunity for the weather conditions to improve and warmup.

Only LHSAA registered tennis coaches are allowed to instruct during a match. No team member, parent, or fan is allowed to communicate with a player during a match. Coaching by a team's registered tennis coach is permitted during both singles and doubles play:
 - 1. From outside the fence, in between points, as long as "continuous play" is observed and players do not come to the fence,
 - 2. During the 90-second, odd-game changeover on all matches with the players remaining on the court and the coach remaining outside the fence, and
 - 3. Between split sets.

Explanation of proposed amendment(s):

This amendment serves to clarify the tennis coaching bylaw by specifying that only LHSAA registered tennis coaches are allowed to instruct players during matches. Further, this slightly increases the latitude that coaches have to instruct their players during matches by allowing them to give a small amount of instruction in between points without disturbing the flow of continuous play on the court. Under the current rule, coaches are not allowed to talk to their players unless they are on the 90-second, odd-game changeover. This often leads to coaches not being allowed to coach their players for a significant amount of time, preventing them from assisting their players in making small corrections that are needed during a game.

- 23.3.2 To qualify for a regional meet in its classification, a school (except Class C) shall participate in a district meet prior to the regional meet. In all classes (except Class C) each district shall conduct a meet to qualify regional contestants. Boys' and girls' outdoor track & field schools shall compete in Divisions I, II, III, IV, V, and VI. Boys' and Girls' track & field shall be divided into six equal or nearly equal divisions. Track & field divisions shall be based on a school's October 1 enrollment that is certified to the LHSAA under the guidelines of Article 8.3 of the Constitution Enrollment Calculation. Counting to achieve equal sixths shall begin with the lowest and end with the highest track and field school enrollment. All-girl schools shall be included in the counting to achieve equal divisions. All boy schools shall be classified according to their enrollment after the track & field schools have been divided. Schools with equal enrollment that form the dividing line in a division shall play in the lower division. A school may not participate in a division below that mandated by its enrollment. A school may elect to play in a higher division if it submits a written declaration to the LHSAA. The declaration shall apply for the next 2 years.
- 23.3.2(1) Each of the six (6) Divisions shall contain nine (9) track and field-only districts, determined independently of the LHSAA's basic districts used for team sports. Districts 1 through 3 shall comprise Region 1; Districts 4 through 6 shall comprise Region 2; Districts 7 through 9 shall comprise Region 3. Division V and VI will not contest the 4x800m relay in postseason.
- 23.3.8 The host of a postseason meet shall comply with the order of running events and contest the field events as stated in SECTION 2 ORDER OF RUNNING EVENTS and SECTION 3 FIELD EVENTS in the NFHS Track & Field Rules Book. There shall be at least a 10-minute time allotment between running events. Exception: Classes C, B, and 1A shall not contest the 4x800-meter relay in the postseason.

23.4 DISTRICT MEETS (Boys and Girls)

- 23.4.1 Boys' and girls' track and field teams shall compete in the LHSAA Classification Committee's <u>Track and Field only</u> assigned districts in Classes 5A, 4A, 3A, 2A, 1A, and B <u>Divisions I, II, III, IV, V, and VI</u>.
- 23.4.2 Schools within their assigned districts in all <u>classes divisions</u> may qualify individual competitors and relay teams for the state meet. In all <u>classes divisions</u>, each district in outdoor track and field shall qualify the same number of individuals (4) and relay teams (4) to the regional meet, regardless of the number of districts in a region.



23.4.16 Because many track and field facilities are without lights and, therefore, cannot be used for night competition and because more than one classification division and/or district may be required to use the same facility on the same day, district track and field meets may begin at 1:00 p.m. with the scratch meeting beginning no earlier than 12:00 noon

23.4.18 Special District Rules for Class 1A (Boys and Girls)

For Class 1A schools only, in a district where four or fewer schools participate with a full track team, three individuals shall be allowed to participate in each event. The exception shall be in the relays when only one relay team from each school participates. Schools may enter a maximum of two contestants in each event for individual competitors unless there are four or fewer schools in a district; otherwise, three individuals shall be allowed to participate in each event. The exception shall be in the relays when only one relay team from each school participates.

- 23.5.1 Regional meets shall be conducted in all classes <u>divisions</u> during the week prior to the state meet to qualify individual contestants and relay teams.
- 23.5.6 The first, second, and third place winners in the individual events and relay teams shall automatically qualify in regionals for the state meet. Classes Divisions shall qualify a maximum of nine contestants in each event from the regional to the state meet. The number of contestants each regional may qualify to the state meet is explained in Bylaw 23.6.21.
- 23.5.11 **Principal's Regional Meet Committee in All Classifications Divisions:**
- 23.5.15 Qualifying Plans and Special Rules for Regional Meets (All Classes Divisions Boys and Girls)
 - 3. <u>Track Surface</u>: Shall be an all-weather surface with a minimum of eight lanes around two turns. For <u>Classes 1A and C Division VI</u>, it shall be a minimum of six lanes around two turns. Lane widths shall be at least 36" (preferably 42"). It is recommended that it shall be marked for use in more than one direction for 100/110-meter hurdles and 100-meter dash.
 - 6. <u>Runways</u> for Jumping and Vaulting Events shall meet minimum lengths specified in NFHS's Outdoor Track and Field Rule Book and shall be marked for use in either direction, except for <u>Classes 1A and C Division VI</u>.

- 23.6.3 In conjunction with the host, the LHSAA shall conduct the state meet at the same site on the same date for all classes divisions in both boys' and girls' outdoor track and field.
- 23.6.4 The Executive Director shall secure possible sites for the state meet and present them to the Executive Committee for selection. The boys' and girls' outdoor track and field state championship meet for all classes divisions shall be held over a three-day period during the 44th calendar week on the dates listed in Bylaw 23.1, "Important Dates" section. Classes B, C, and 1A Divisions V and VI shall be conducted on Thursday, Classes 2A and 3A Divisions III and IV shall be conducted on Friday, and Classes 4A and 5A Divisions I and II shall be conducted on Saturday.
- 23.6.10 Each <u>class division</u> shall determine its own individual contestants' and relay teams' qualifying methods from the regional to the state meet. In devising its qualifying plan, a <u>class division</u> shall comply with LHSAA constitutional rules and by-laws and NFHS's Outdoor Track and Field Rule Book.
- 23.6.11 Each <u>class division</u> shall be limited to a maximum of nine qualifying individual contestants and relay teams in each event from its regional to the state meet.
 - 1. Each <u>class division</u>'s schools shall qualify individual contestants and relay teams in each event from the regional meets conducted the week prior to the state meet.
 - 2. Only contestants and relay teams (including alternate contestants) that qualify in a regional meet shall compete in the state meet.
 - 3. All <u>classes divisions</u>' first-, second- and third-place finishers in regional individual and relay events shall automatically qualify for the state meet.
 - 4. If fewer than nine regional meet individual contestants and relay teams in Class C Division VI automatically qualify to the state meet, then to fill the field with nine participants for each event, the state meet coordinator would use the next best time or mark from the three regions reported to LHSAA to fill the event. No school would be allowed to have more than one relay team or two individuals in an event. The best times and marks would be used until each event has nine participants.
 - 5. Each <u>class division</u> shall develop a state meet qualifying plan for alternate contestants and relay teams. 6. Class B and C will compete in their class at the state track meet.



23.6.14 Order of Events and Time-Interval Schedule

- 2. The LHSAA shall incorporate the different classes <u>divisions</u> for the boys' and girls' teams into the order of events when formulating the schedule of events for the state meet.
- 3. The boys' and girls' 3200-meter run shall be scheduled after the 200-meter dash, back-to-back, with the 1600-meter relay in each sport alternating with that respective elass division.

23.6.22 <u>Interrupted Competition</u>: If competition is interrupted because of events beyond the control of the responsible administrative officials, the competition shall be completed the next day from the point of interruption. If this is not possible, the meet must be resumed within 72 hours following the cancellation of the original meet. If the meet cannot be completed within 72 hours, there shall be no team champions named in that <u>class/</u>division unless the points earned by any school(s) competing will not change the outcome of the meet.



- 23.7.5 A wheelchair participant shall compete for individual and team honors in the classification division in which his/her team competes in the meet. Meet scoring for wheelchair participants shall be as follows:
- 23.7.7 If a wheelchair participant competes against another wheelchair participant in the same sport (boys/girls), in the same <u>classification</u> <u>divisions</u> and in the same event, the contestant that finishes first shall be declared the champion and shall score 2 team points.

This proposal restructures outdoor track & field postseason competitions by transitioning from seven (7) traditional classifications to six (6) equal Divisions based on enrollment. Currently, Class 1A includes schools with similar enrollment to Class B and C, but they are separated due to participation in football. This new divisional model removes that segmentation and allows all schools to compete in postseason track & field against schools with like enrollment. It also removes the need for track & field to be restricted by the basic team-sport districting, allowing for new, dedicated track districts that enhance geographic balance and meet management. Reducing from 7 to 6 Divisions will streamline the postseason, making equitable qualifying rounds while maintaining a competitive environment.

Pros: (Must have at least one)

- Creates more equitable postseason competition by aligning all schools into divisions based purely on enrollment
- Ends unnecessary separation between 1A, B, and C schools with the same enrollment levels
- Dedicated track-only districts will improve competitiveness and equity between qualifying events within each division. 21-22 schools per region and 7-8 schools per district.
- Simplifying logistics in postseason while maintaining quality competition.
- Better geographic alignment across three regions of the state
- Creates a legitimate postseason for all divisions and aligns with the 6 divisions in cross country in which membership voted in favor.
- Aligns all sports into Divisions for consistency.

Cons: (Must have at least one)

- Reduces the state championships by one.
- Eliminates historical Classification championships.
- Restarts historical track & field Classification state records. All previous Classification records will be permanently grandfathered while composite records will continue.

23.4.9 This information shall be used to seed regional competitors.

23.4.10 If the district meet is conducted on a track constructed in yards, running events shall be conducted in metric or equivalent distances.

23.4.11 The English measurement system shall be applied in measuring heights and distances in field events.

23.4.12 Seeding for running events shall be established according to the seeding procedure explained in Bylaw 23.6.16(9). The meet director shall draw for lanes in the presence of witnesses from another schoolin the district when seeding the contestants in lanes.

23.4.13 The 200-meter dash shall be run on the curve.

23.4.14 A jury of appeals shall be formed to consider appeals filed at the meet and to make other decisions within its authority as specified in the Outdoor Track and Field Rule Book.

23.4.15 A coaches' scratch meeting shall be conducted prior to the meet. Coaches shall attend the scratch meeting.

23.4.16 Because many track and field facilities are without lights and, therefore, cannot be used for night competition and because more than one classification and/or district may be required to use the same facility on the same day, district track and field meets may begin at 1:00 p.m. with the scratch meeting beginning no earlier than 12:00 noon.

23.4.17 Scoring: The scoring method explained in Bylaw 23.3.11 shall be used to score all district meets.

23.4.18 Special District Rules for Class 1A (Boys and Girls)

For Class 1A schools only, in a district where four or fewer schools participate with a full track team, three individuals shall be allowed to participate in each event. The exception shall be in the relays when only one relay team from each school participates. Schools may enter a maximum of two contestants in each eventfor individual competitors unless there are four or fewer schools in a district; otherwise, three individuals shall be allowed to participate in each event. The exception shall be in the relays when only one relay team from each school participates.

23.5.5 Preliminary running events shall not be conducted. if the track consists of enough lanes To accommodate each event's 16 entries, a two-heat final shall be conducted with the slow heat first. Preliminary running events, if necessary, shall be conducted following the order of events schedule explained in Bylaw 23.3.8.

23.5.7 Scratches & Declaration Meeting/Team Packets

- 1. There will be no scratch meeting for the regional meet. Schools that qualify contestants from the top 16 descending order list from the district meet to the regional meet will automatically be declared. Schools intending to scratch those qualifiers shall declare by 12:00 noon two (2) days prior to the regional meet any scratches for those qualifying to the regional meet. It will be the responsibility of the school that scratches a contestant to notify the alternate school qualifier (next qualifier on the descending order list) and the meet director by 12:00 noon two (2) days 10:00 a.m. on the Monday prior to the regional meet. Schools failing to scratch contestants prior to 12:00 noon two (2) days 10:00 a.m. on the Monday prior to the regional meet shall be fined \$50 per contestant unless a letter from a doctor or the principal stipulates that the contestant was unable to compete due to medical reasons or other unusual circumstances. Scratches to the regional meet are solely the responsibility of the school who is scratching and those shall be emailed to the host school on school letterhead signed by the head coach.
- 23.5.7(5). If a qualifying contestant from the district meet descending order list is scratched and the alternate is not notified by noon, two days prior to the meet, there shall be no replacement allowed.
- 23.5.8 Substitutions on Relay Teams: A coach may substitute a contestant to participate with his/her relay team if the contestant's name is listed on the relay entry-form provided to the regional meet director bythe respective district meet directors at the conclusion of the district meet and if the substitute's participation limit of four events is not exceeded. by 12:00 noon two (2) days prior to the regional meet.
- 23.5.12 Substitutions: A school may list a maximum of eight contestants for each relay event and only



contestants whose names are listed on the official relay entry form shall participate in those events. If a contestant's name is not listed on the relay entry form submitted from the district meet director to the regional meet director by 12:00 noon two (2) days prior to the regional meet, the contestant shall not be a substitute in that relay event at the regional meet.

23.5.13 Withdrawal from the Meet: If a contestant elects to withdraw from an event or the entire meet, the alternate contestant's school shall notify the regional meet director and coach of the alternate contestant (next qualifier on the descending order list) of this withdrawal no later than 10:00 a.m. on the Monday prior to the meet.

23.5.15(9) Seeding Process: Contestants in qualifying events shall be seeded/flighted according to their district meet times marks on the descending order list. If fully automatic time (FAT) is available, all qualifying shall be against time. If FAT timing is unavailable or the timing device malfunctions, qualifiers shall be seeded according to the places they finished in each heat. In all other events, contestants shall be seeded/flighted according to time and/or performance.

Explanation of proposed amendment(s):

This amendment provides for a new qualification method for the regional track & field meets. The top 16 athletes and relays per event, per region, will qualify for regional meets based on a descending order list compiled from certified meets throughout the regular season. There will no longer be automatic regional qualifiers from the district meets, however the district meets may be certified for those performances to count towards the descending order list. Regional meets will then qualify the top 3 athletes and relays in head-to head competition as normal to the state meet. This proposal also provides the opportunity for a 3rd individual from the same school to compete at the regional meet provided they are ranked in the top 8 of their event. The 3rd individual will not score team points at the regional; however, they will have an opportunity to qualify for the state meet. Minimum standards are also included for the high jump and pole vault to not only provide a goal for those participants, but also to maintain the integrity of this new qualifying event.

Pros: (Must have at least one)

- Allows for the best athletes from a region to have an opportunity to qualify for state.
- Allows an additional athlete from the same school an opportunity to qualify for state.
- Removes a qualifying round from the 3-week postseason.

Cons: (Must have at least one)

- District meets no longer receive automatic regional qualifiers.
- Schools without athletes in the top 16 may not have representation in the postseason.
- Schools must certify their meets with the LHSAA in order to have postseason qualifiers.

- 25.7.1 The state wrestling tournaments shall be conducted under the auspices of the LHSAA. The state tournament shall be administered by a committee composed of the Executive Director, the Executive Director's Assistant, and Executive Committee members. The tournament committee shall set policies for tournament administration.
- 25.7.2 The state wrestling tournament shall be conducted during the 32nd week of the NFHS calendar. If the week conflicts with Mardi Gras weekend, the date(s) of the tournament shall be adjusted by the LHSAA Executive Committee
- 25.7.3 The LHSAA shall form a State Tournament committee to select the site of the State Tournament and coordinate the event. The site shall be approved by the Executive Committee. The state tournament will be held at the site selected and, on the dates, listed in Bylaw 25.1, "Important Dates" section. The Executive Director shall secure the services of a physician to serve as the official tournament physician for the state tournament. Any and All decisions of the physician concerning injuries and/or communicable diseases will be final.
- 25.7.4 Boys' Division I, II and III schools and Girls' Division shall submit their entries through Trackwrestling coaches' administrative website. Schools may only submit one wrestler per weight class. All information must be posted on Trackwrestling the coaches' administrative website no later than the state entries due date cited in Bylaw



- 25.1, "Important Dates" section. Schools failing to post their wrestler(s) information on the Trackwrestling coaches' administrative website by 10:00 p.m. on the date cited in Bylaw 25.1, "Important Dates", shall be fined \$100 and their wrestler(s) shall not be seeded.
- <u>25.7.5</u> **Qualification Allotment** Individual qualifiers shall be allotted for the LHSAA State Wrestling Tournament as follows:

25.7.6 **Qualification Process** – All individuals for the LHSAA State Wrestling Tournament shall be selected based on the LHSAA Wrestling Power Ratings System ("LWPRS") created by Rank Wrester:

Final Ranking Score = (Adjusted Percentage + Three Best)/2 + Head-to-Head Adjustment

The LWPRS rankings shall be final at 12:00 p.m. on the Sunday of 32nd week. All wrestlers shall only be ranked in the weight class in which he or she was submitted in accordance with 25.7.4 at this deadline. The LWPRS shall only be used to determine those wrestlers qualifying for the tournament; seeding the bracket shall be done in accordance with Bylaw 25.7.8. When determining qualifiers:

- 1. The top ranked 24 wrestlers submitted by their schools in Boys Division I shall qualify for the state tournament.
- 2. The top ranked 16 wrestlers submitted by their schools in the Girls Division and Boys Division II shall qualify for the state tournament.
- 3. The top ranked 8 wrestlers in Boys Division III shall qualify for the state tournament.
- 25.7.76 Each state tournament wrestler shall abide by the weigh-in rules as governed by the NFHS Wrestling Rules.
- 25.7.8 State Tournament Seeding Seeds for the LHSAA State Tournament shall be awarded as follows:

<u>Division</u>	Number of Seeds
Boys I	<u>Top 8</u>
<u>Girls</u>	<u>Top 6</u>
Boys II	<u>Top 6</u>
Boys III	<u>Top 4</u>

The state tournament's official seeding meeting (Boys' Divisions I, II, and III, and Girls' Division) shall be the Monday night prior to the tournament of the 32nd week. Seeds shall be made based on the criteria in the LHSAA State Wrestling Tournament Bulletin. In every division and in every weight class, the official seeding committee shall designate an additional seeded wrestler in the event that a seeded wrestler must be pulled from the bracket prior to the beginning of the tournament. Substitutions shall be allowed until the conclusion of the coaches' meeting the Thursday night before the state tournament. The submitted wrestler(s) shall not be seeded. To substitute (not add) a wrestler(s) at a weight class, they must be a wrestler already designated for that weight class. Individuals already submitted for a particular weight class in the state tournament shall not be moved.

- 25.7.9 Substitutions The substitution deadline is 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday of the 32nd Week. Substitutions should only occur due to the injury or illness of a qualified wrestler. If the team requesting a substitution has another wrestler whose LWPRS ranking is higher than that of the lowest ranked qualified wrestler in the weight class, they may substitute the second wrestler for the first. However, the substituted wrestler shall not be seeded. Teams attempting to substitute a wrestler must notify the LHSAA State Wrestling Tournament Director and the Division coordinator prior to the deadline.
- 25.7.10 **Drops and Additions** In the event that any qualified wrestler must be removed from the tournament before 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday of the 32nd Week, the allotted spot in the weight class shall go to the next highest ranked wrestler who has not qualified for the state tournament. This wrestle shall not be seeded.



25.7.11-7 A \$15.00 entry fee per wrestler shall be sent to the LHSAA by school check payable to the LHSAA along with a list of qualifiers to the state tournament by the established deadline. Schools that owe any money to the LHSAA for testing and website access shall be ineligible to compete in the state tournament until such fees are paid.

- 25.7.128 Brackets The LHSAA State Wrestling Tournament shall be a double elimination tournament in all divisions.
 - 1. <u>Boys Division I shall use a 32-man 24-man bracket and the top 8 seeds shall receive a bye in the first round.</u>

 Teams scores for Boys Division I shall not be awarded in Championship Round One or Consolation Round One. Any additional byes on the bracket due to injury, illness, weight, or medical elimination, shall be placed on the bracket at random.
 - 2. Division II and III and The Girls Division and Boys Division II shall use either a 16-man bracket or a 32-man bracket which shall be determined by the tournament director based on the number of entries per weight class. Any byes on the bracket due to injury, illness, weight, or medical elimination, shall be placed on the bracket at random.
 - 3. <u>Boys Division III shall use an 8-man bracket.</u> Any byes on the bracket due to injury, illness, weight, or medical elimination, shall be placed on the bracket at random.
 - 4. Pigtail matches shall be used for any weight class that has more than 32 competitors in Division I. Division II and III shall be based on the number of entries per weight class. This round shall not score.
 - 5. The brackets, for a division, shall be re-drawn when a seeded wrestler is not able to wrestle in the tournament on the first day.
- 25.7.<u>13-9</u> A wrestler detected destroying or damaging property during the state tournament shall be suspended from competition for the remainder of the tournament and the school shall be required to pay for all damages incurred and fined an additional \$250 for unsportsmanlike and unethical conduct.

Explanation of proposed amendment(s):

This amendment serves to bring Louisiana's State Wrestling Tournament in line with the rest of the country by adding a qualifying process. Entries to the State Tournament have increased over the past few years to the point where the management of the tournament in an efficient and timely manner has become an issue. Every other state manages entries into its state tournament through a qualifying process. This process will be formulistic, which prevents having to add weeks to the season and will allow coaches to monitor qualifying placement throughout the season in real time.

Pros: (*Must have at least one*)

- (1) Maintains the current length of the wrestling season
- (2) Increases the efficiency of the state tournament
- (3) Creates consistent bracketing in all three divisions
- (4) Reduces byes in the state tournament
- (5) Decreases time delays in the state tournament
- (6) Decreases set-up and pick-up times for the state tournament
- (7) Decreases the cost of operating the state tournament
- (8) Decreases time out of the classroom for a select number of wrestlers
- (9) Entry fees owed to the LHSAA by schools will decrease
- (10) Opens up more potential venues to host the state meet
- (11) Reduces travel expenditures for LHSAA schools

Cons: (*Must have at least one*)

- (1) Not every wrestler will qualify for the state tournament
- (2) Entry fees owed to the LHSAA by schools will decrease
