ALLSTATE SUGAR BOWL LHSAA STATE GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS -- Division I Boys Final Story Tuesday, May 4, 2021, at The Farm d'Allie (6,516 yards, par 72), Carencro, La.

CARENCRO – Griffith Dorr won a sudden-death playoff for the individual title and led his St. Paul's squad to the team championship here Tuesday in the final round of the Division I boys' competition in the Allstate Sugar Bowl LHSAA State Golf Championships.

Dorr, who posted a bogey-free, seven-under-par 65 in Monday's opening round, struggled to a threeover 75 in Tuesday's final trip around the 6,516-yard par-72 Farm d'Allie layout. That was still good enough to tie with Noah McWilliams of Benton, who matched his first-round 70 on Tuesday, and force a playoff.

Both players birdied the par-five first hole, but McWilliams ran into trouble with his tee shot on the par-four second hole and Dorr eventually won the hole with a par.

St. Paul's led the field by 17 strokes entering Tuesday's final round after a stellar 11-under-par 277 score on Monday. The Wolves put together a one-over 289 on Tuesday and finished at 566, good enough for a 28-stroke victory over runner-up Benton at 594.

Catholic-Baton Rouge finished third at 597 and C. E. Byrd, the 2019 team champion and in second place entering the final round, was fourth at 600.

St. Paul's had three of the top four individual finishers, with Joshua Achord in third at 73-68—141 and Kason Shaw in fourth at 68-74—142. Teammate Gil Ward tied for fifth along with Zach Robertson of Barbe and Peyton Canter of St. Amant, all at one-under 143, while Eli Hill of Airline was the only other player to match par with a 144 score.

Achord and Canter shared low-round honors Tuesday, both posting four-under 68 scores.
