

LHSAA Recognizes 94 Schools for Violation-Free 2025-26 School Year

Four schools earn their fifth recognition as the number of violation-free schools increases more than 30-percent from the previous year

BATON ROUGE — The Louisiana High School Athletic Association (LHSAA) is proud to recognize 94 member schools that completed the 2025-26 school year violation-free, earning the designation of LHSAA School of Distinction.

The 94 schools represent approximately 24-percent of the LHSAA membership and mark a significant increase from the previous school year, with the number of violation-free schools growing by more than 30-percent from 2024-25.

The School of Distinction recognition honors schools that demonstrate a strong commitment to understanding and following LHSAA rules and regulations throughout the school year. The accomplishment reflects the work of school administrators, athletic directors, coaches, faculty, staff and student-athletes in maintaining a culture of compliance and education-based athletics.

“Being violation-free is a significant accomplishment and one that deserves to be recognized,” said LHSAA Executive Director Eddie Bonine. “It represents the commitment of an entire school community to understanding our rules, following our processes and doing things the right way. We are proud of the 94 schools receiving this recognition and especially proud to see so many schools earning this distinction for the first time.”

Of the 94 schools recognized this year, 31 are receiving the School of Distinction recognition for the first time.

Four schools have reached an even more significant milestone, earning their fifth School of Distinction recognition:

- Academy of the Sacred Heart – New Orleans
- Ecole Classique
- Louisiana School for the Visually Impaired
- St. Joseph School - Plaquemine

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The increase in violation-free schools from the previous year highlights a growing commitment among LHSAA member schools to compliance and the standards established for education-based athletics across Louisiana.

To commemorate the achievement, each recognized school will receive an LHSAA School of Distinction retractable banner to display on its campus. Banners are scheduled to be distributed to schools throughout August.

The LHSAA congratulates all 94 School of Distinction recipients for this accomplishment and recognizes the administrators, athletic directors, coaches, faculty, staff and student-athletes whose commitment to compliance made this achievement possible.
